## **New Territory**

At the end of the book of Deuteronomy and the beginning of the book of Joshua, Israel was faced with a major transition. They had been blessed with leadership from Moses for over 40 years and found themselves standing before a place where they knew they were called to go. It was a land that offered so much hope that it was called the "Promised Land." This new territory was central to the plan of redemption, and God himself had decreed that his people would settle in it and flourish. There they stood, the wilderness behind them and the Jordan River in front of them. Moses told Joshua and the people that he would not be going any further. (Dt 31:2)

This was not the first time they stood near this location. Forty years earlier a few Israeli spies had entered this land and returned to the people with a foreboding report. In it were fierce warriors larger than life. Prospects looked grim even though it truly was a land of great wealth and resources. The people shrunk back, put their tail between their legs, and spent decades wandering aimlessly in the desert. We can only imagine the debacle which occurred forty years before was running through the minds of this new generation as they deliberated about their next steps. The same fearsome obstacles still lay before them.

The Lord had a word for Israel and their newly minted leader, Joshua. "Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (Jos 1:9) Fast forward twenty-five years and Israel would call the Promised Land their home. Years later God would direct David to Jerusalem, Solomon would build a great temple, and God himself would dwell among his people in an unprecedented way. Peace and prosperity was realized. Israel became a shining light to the nations of God's goodness, grace, and power.

Triangle Grace Church is entering into new and unfamiliar territory. Great possibilities and promise are what we know in our hearts are on the horizon. But we also need to acknowledge that what lay before us is unsettling. We are going forward without the amazing shepherd who had protected and provided for us for over 30 years. Even more, we are walking in the midst of an unparalleled time of cultural division that surely rivalled the giants of the land of Canaan. Enemies seem ready to pounce around every corner.

Here is the right word for Triangle Grace Church in this moment, "Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified, do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." We can be strong and courageous because God is with us on this journey. We need not fear, nor should we get discouraged because God is the one who will ensure we arrive at our ordained destination in the coming days. Truth be told, that is how it has always been for Triangle Grace Church. As gifted as a leader Ray Cobb is, it has actually been the Lord who has provided for and protected this church since its inception. And regardless of the deficiencies and failures of your new senior leader, it will continue to be the Lord who will guard and care for and ensure the wellbeing of Triangle Grace. He is the great shepherd who will lead his flock to green pastures and living water.

"Be strong and courageous" became the rallying cry of God's people throughout scripture. Joshua repeated this phrase to his army battle after battle during the conquest of Canaan. (Jos 10:25) David encouraged his troops with these same words. (2Sam 2:7) David told Solomon to be strong and courageous as he passed on the leadership of the kingdom to him. (1 Ch 22:13) King Hezekiah emboldened his army as they battled their fierce enemy Assyria by exhorting them to "be strong and courageous." (2Chr 32:7) An angel fortified Daniel with these words. (Da 10:12) The prophet Haggai repeated this statement to the remnant who returned to Judah to rebuild the temple. (Hag 2:4) Paul even spoke these words to the Corinthians. (1Co 16:13)

As we move forward together, Triangle Grace Church, be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid for the Lord your God is with you. Know that it is the Lord who promises to protect and provide for you. May good cheer and optimism reign among us as we trust in him and see to what flourishing fields he may lead.


