Holy Week 2022

While visiting southern Spain a couple years ago, I learned about the massive celebrations which are held in the streets of cities such as Cordoba, Malaga, and Seville during Holy Week. Click here to learn about one of the cities, Malaga. Festivals, parades, floats, singing, rejoicing, and all kinds of lavish expressions of jubilance fill the streets. I can only imagine how deeply such celebrations have left their imprint on the people who grew up there as they participated in these city holiday experiences. Thinking about Holy Week celebrations in my teen years, my mind goes back to the Methodist Church in which I grew up, and how moving the choir processional was for me on Easter morning in a packed church while everyone sang Christ the Lord is Risen Today. Easter flowers, fabulous choral pieces, and inspiring sermons all added up to a capstone experience each year remembering the amazing work Christ had done to redeem us.

At my previous church, my appreciation grew significantly for the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services we would hold each year. Those were not really a part of my experience up until that point. Both had a rawness about them that penetrated areas of my heart which needed prodding. They were stark services which led to lamentation for Christ, for the world, and for me. Sin was no longer crouching at my door, but was exposed for what it was, what it does, and the extent our Lord had to go to redeem us from it. Of course, such reflection prompted by these nights of remorseful worship only heightened the joy of Easter morning.

This year's Holy Week services at Triangle Grace Church will be different than those you have experienced in the past. The staff and elders have been gracious to allow me to shape our services to reflect some of which I have noted above. On either end of these seven days, we will have two marvelous gatherings of celebration. Palm Sunday will welcome us to the week with passionate singing, palm waving, and a recognition of our Prince of Peace, "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!" Rather than having one mid-week service we will hold two - a Maundy Thursday service, and a Good Friday service. The former will offer us the opportunity to remember what transpired the night Jesus was betrayed as we eat the Lord's Supper together. At the end of the service, the church will be stripped. The Good Friday service will be dark, minimal, and moving as we reflect on Christ's death on our behalf. To start Easter morning off, we will continue the tradition of holding an intimate sunrise service by the columbarium followed by a breakfast to lead into the 8:30 service. Easter Sunday services will of course be a blowout celebration with brass, pomp, the Hallelujah Chorus, and a whole lot more. Four youth will also be confirmed!

The four services (five if you get up early on Easter for the sunrise gathering!) should **all** be experienced. If you miss one, you will miss a part of the story. Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter will be viewed as one continuous service as we will not pronounce a benediction until after the Easter service is completed. There will be a greater degree of formality throughout the week to remind us of the seriousness of the joyful truth we celebrate as the people of God. Look in the bulletin for specific information about times and childcare for each of the services as well as the special children's program between our Easter morning services. Consider who you might invite out to one or all of these services. Hope you join us on Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday!

May the Lord bless you as we remember his death and celebrate his resurrection in the coming days together!

As the Season of LENT continues, the Children's team has planned a series of special activities for kids on specific Sundays during Lent, as well as study topics for Children's Worship and Sunday clubs, aligning with the events of Holy Week, the last week of Jesus' earthly life.
