There are good lessons to take to heart for us as we live through both a transitional and transformative moment in our corporate life together as the people of God at Triangle Grace Church.

The staff has been working on plans for the summer. Our primary focus this coming summer will be on fellowship, community, and relationship building as we seek to live our lives out for Jesus. The summer is an ideal time to offer opportunities to gather, for recreation, refreshment, and renewal before plunging back into active, focused ministry at the end of August and beyond. Keep your eyes out later in May for specifics of events and gatherings! As soon as plans are set for the summer, the staff and Session will begin to look towards the fall to set priorities and objective which will guide our worship, discipleship, fellowship, and mission experiences for the coming church year.

Our Music Director, Ledda Rosenberger, will be returning to her home country of the Philippines for the summer after a three-year absence to visit family and work on a doctoral degree. She will be away from the end of May through most of August and will return to lead our music team after what we hope will be a refreshing time away for her. We have an amazing music team who will fill the gaps during Ledda's trip under the competent coordination of Matt McLaughlin. We also hope to secure an "Artist-In-Residence" for the summer adding a fresh voice and leadership to our already gifted praise team. You can look at the job posting on our website about this. On March 8, the Session approved moving to **Mask Optional** indoors as of March 9, 2022. Children who are 5th grade and under should continue to wear masks indoors in all children's programs (following Durham Public schools) until further reviewed April 12. On April 5th, the TGC Session voted to follow the recommendation of the Durham Public Schools, which will start a Mask Recommended but optional policy on Monday, April 11th.

Covenant made and continued

In spite of hurricanes, historic devastation and loss of lives resulting from the earthquake in 2010, a global pandemic and civil unrest caused by political instability, Pastor Leon Dorleans has managed to continue to influence generations of Haitians (and Americans). The three churches founded from the modest Bible study he led in the 1980s continue to grow and have served as beacons of hope in their communities in the poorest sections of Port Au Prince, Haiti.

Pastor Leon and his wife, Jacky, recognized that education and training were the fundamental tools needed to help the people realize their potential. They led the efforts to establish rigorous educational opportunities to the next generations of Haiti's leaders. Since the parents had little income to pay the full cost for that education, Leon and the leadership team assumed the task of raising sponsorship funds for each student. In fact, much of Pastor Leon's energy was directed toward encouraging individuals and churches in the United States to identify one or two students whom they would be willing to sponsor for at least one year.

Hearing Leon's and Jacky's story and seeing the schools in action, in 2009 a small team from Triangle Presbyterian Church was moved to seek a better way to raise the necessary support. This group (which included Garret Nelson, Grant Harvey, Won Kyoo Lee, Jim Pease and several others) returned from their trip to Haiti and shared an exciting vision concerning the possibility of sponsoring an entire class of pre-k students who were about to begin their academic careers at the school(s) administered by Madame Jacky Dorleans (Pastor Leon's wife). Instead of looking to raise funds for a few students for one or two years, the team felt that agreeing to provide funds for the entire class would relieve Leon (and Jacky) from the burden of finding ongoing support for these students. And, as an additional benefit, the congregation would have the chance to follow these students throughout their careers.

The covenant that they presented was to agree to sponsor these 29 children as long as they remained in a school supervised or validated by Pastor Leon and Jacky Dorleans and the response from the congregation was enthusiastic. Some Triangle folks wanted to be paired with a particular student and have followed that student's progress over the years. Of the original 29 students, 17 are still in school and currently attend the Barye Fe secondary school (high school).

Just as some of the original students have not been able to continue with the class, some of Triangle's initial supporters dropped out, but Triangle Grace intends to be faithful to the promises made back in 2009. Through memorial contributions and individual participation, TGC has been able to stand beside the students and their families to encourage the development of these future leaders of Haiti. The current cost, \$720 per year for each student, is really a worthwhile investment. If you would like to join this effort, please designate your contribution of any amount to Haiti School sponsorship and help keep the covenant strong!
